



# ALL ABOUT *Miss Nham*


# Discipline Procedures

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# OUR CLASS SCHEDULE



**Bible-** A weekly verse and BTCC (Bible Truths for Christian Growth) quiz will be given each Friday. Study guides will be sent home every Monday.

**Math-** It will be essential for each student to master the math facts: addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division tables 1-12! Students will have either a quiz or test every week.

**Spelling-** Students will study a list of words each week. Tests will be given on Fridays. Trial tests will be given on Thursdays. The trial test is intended to be a practice test and is not recorded for a grade. However, if a student scores 100% on his trial test, he will not need to take the test on Friday. ☺

**Language-** Tests focusing on application of grammar and writing will be given periodically.


**Reading-** A variety of comprehension exercises and oral reading will be given throughout the week. Book reports will also be assigned throughout the year. Third graders will have assigned reading homework throughout the week.

**Handwriting-** Assignments will be evaluated with a non-percentage grade (E- Excellent, G- Good, S- Satisfactory, N- Needs Improvement).

**Science & History-** Unit tests will be given periodically and a few projects will be assigned throughout the year. Details will be sent home when they are introduced.




# Homework



Each day, students will be writing their homework assignments and upcoming tests and quizzes in their assignment notebook. The notebook should be signed each evening by a parent. To encourage student responsibility, failure to get it signed will result in the loss of "Snoopy Bucks." Students will be required to complete assigned homework and turn it in by 8:00 a.m. the following day. All late work will receive an academic penalty.

# Birthdays



To celebrate birthdays, students may bring a treat for the class which will be eaten at lunch. If you choose to send a treat, please send something that can be distributed quickly such as cookies, cupcakes, etc. (no sheet cakes, ice cream that must be scooped, etc.) Treats should be labeled with your child's name and grade and taken to the kitchen in the morning, rather than the classroom.
